The itinerary

Day 1

Australia - Osaka, Japan

Today depart from Sydney for Osaka with China Southern Airlines, China Eastern Airlines, Air China or Vietnam Airlines to name a few.

Meals included: In flight

Day 2

Arrive in Osaka

This is where your exciting journey begins. Once you arrive in Osaka, you'll be met at the airport and taken to the hotel where you can relax and enjoy the evening in this vibrant city.

Overnight: Osaka Hotel

Day 3

Osaka – Kurashiki – Fukuyama

Today you'll travel towards the city of Fukuyama. En-route, stop in a region known for its Sake production just outside the city of Kobe, where you'll visit the famous Hakutsuru Sake Brewery and learn how traditional Japanese Sake is made. After, continue to the town of Kurashiki and visit the Bikan Historical Quarter. With its scenic canals lined with weeping willows, Edo-period gardens and historic merchant houses, the Kurashiki Bikan Historical Quarter offers an authentic taste of old Japan in one of the oldest merchant towns. Travel on to Fukuyama and enjoy the night at your leisure.

Overnight: Fukuyama Hotel

Day 4

Fukuyama – Hiroshima – Fukuyama

After breakfast travel to Miyajimaguchi and take a short cruise over to Miyajima Island where you'll see UNESCO World Heritage

site, Itsukushima Shrine. After Miyajima, travel to Hiroshima and visit Hiroshima Peace Memorial Park. See the strings of paper cranes representing peace and the Atomic Bomb Dome, the only original structure left standing in the area. You'll also visit the Hiroshima Peace Memorial Museum, featuring exhibitions of items related to the atomic bomb and advocating for world peace and the abolishment of nuclear weapons. This afternoon head back to Fukuyama for an evening at your leisure.

Day 5

Fukuyama – Osaka

This morning you'll leave Fukuyama and journey back to Osaka. Upon arrival in Osaka, stop to explore the Osaka Castle Garden. Surrounded by greenery, the garden commands a splendid view of the castle tower and stone wall surrounding the moat. The castle is one of Japan's most famous landmarks and played a major role in the unification of Japan during the Azuchi-Momoyama period in the sixteenth century. Later today, enjoy some free time in Shinsaibashi, the prime shopping area in Osaka before going back to the hotel for the evening.

Day 6

Osaka – Kyoto – Nagoya

Today depart Osaka and head to Nagoya. On the way visit the amazing Kinkaku-ji (Golden Pavilion), a UNESCO Heritage Listed site and perfect spot to snap an iconic photo of Kyoto. Afterwards visit Fushimi Inari Shrine, famous for its thousands of vermilion torii gates, which straddle a network of trails behind its main buildings. The trails lead into the wooded forest of the sacred Mount Inari, standing at 233m the forest is well-known thanks to its appearance in the film *Memoirs of a Geisha*. In the afternoon

continue onwards to Nagoya where you can spend the evening however you like.

Day 7

Nagoya – Narai-juku – Matsumoto

This morning visit Atsuta Jingu shrine in Nagoya, one of Shinto's most important shrines. It enshrines the Sun Goddess Amaterasu and stores the sacred sword Kusanagi, one of the three imperial regalia. This afternoon visit Narai-juku, an old town taking you back hundreds of years to 17th century Japan and Tsumagoi Village. Finally, continue onto Matsumoto and check into the hotel for the night.

Day 8

Matsumoto – Mt Fuji – Lake Ashi – Yokohama

Today, leave Matsumoto and drive to Mt Fuji's 5th Station. Located 2300m above sea level, it offers a vantage point for Mt Fuji and the surrounding lakes. The 5th Station also features shrines, torii gates and souvenir shops. Afterwards continue onwards to Lake Ashi to admire the scenery as you take a short cruise across the lake. This evening arrive in Yokohama, check into your hotel for the evening.

Day 9

Yokohama – Tokyo

See the best of Tokyo today as you visit some of the city's main shrines and shopping areas. First up is the Meiji Shrine, a key Shinto religious site that was dedicated to the Imperial Family in 1926. Then drive past the Japanese House of Parliament to the

Imperial Palace East Garden. This idyllic outdoor space, home to a traditional Japanese garden, tea pavilion, stone walls and moat, is situated within the complex of an Edo-era castle. Continue to Nakamise Shopping Street and Asakusa Kannon Temple, one of Japan's most important Buddhist sites. Explore the neon-tinged streets of the Ginza district, a premier shopping destination of department stores and cinemas.

Climate and average temperature

Summer: June to August

Japanese summer begins in June and it becomes hot and humid from July onward. Summer is when many interesting festivals and other events are held all over the country.

Clothing: light clothes (cardigans and other similar kinds are handy, since indoors are mostly air-conditioned.)

Autumn: September to November

Autumn always brings such freshness with a light breeze and cool temperature after the hot and humid summer. The Autumn colours are very beautiful across the country.

Tour guide vs tour leader

Tour guide

Often locals with intimate knowledge of an area, its culture, and history. Their role entails providing commentary, routing the tour, and seeing that people have a good time. They are a licensed, qualified expert who supplies specific information on history, art, architecture and culture of the city/village/attraction in which

he or she is guiding the tour. The guide meets the group at the required place and leaves the group at the end of the tour. They do not travel with the group.

Tour leader

An experienced person tasked with ensuring the smooth operation of tours, as well as providing practical support to passengers throughout the whole trip. Their role primarily includes assisting with accommodation, transportation between locations, and communication with tour guides in each stop. A tour leader may provide general guidance around a city or village, and offer information on the place visited on the bus, however they are not required to have specific knowledge on art, architecture, or history. They are not allowed to provide a guided tour or commentary of a city/village/attraction once there and if caught doing so, can be fined.

Please note: Tour leaders/guides are not a standard inclusion in all travel offers. Tour leaders/guides will only be made available when particularly required to enhance the experience of the destination featured.

Coach tour

Meals:

Daily breakfast is included in the tour, for all other meals; lunches and dinners the tour leader (when available) will offer assistance with reservations, suggestions and directions to local restaurants. You can also enquire about any allergies and food and if necessary advise meals to be to be prepared with any medication you require.

Luggage:

You will be responsible for all your personal belongings whilst on the tour. With regards to luggage, you must carry your own luggage from the coach to the hotel room and back to the coach. The driver will assist with the uploading and off-loading of the luggage from the coach.

Gratuities:

Gratuities (tips) are not included in the tour price for services of the tour leader (when available) and driver throughout the tour. The mandatory tip for the tour leader and driver is \$10 AUD per person per day, which will be collected whilst on tour.

Fitness level required/mobility:

Our vehicles are not equipped with wheelchair access, so unfortunately our tours are currently not suitable for wheelchair users and those less mobile.

Please note: A general level of fitness will be required. If you have any concerns please consult your healthcare provider prior to purchase/travel.

Visas

A tourist visa for Japan is not required if traveling on an Australian Passport.
